Carlos Rodríguez-Pastor, GPC Member, and his family fled Peru in 1968 after a political coup, because his father was an official of the Peruvian Central Bank. They settled in California where Carlos went to the University of California, Berkeley. He earned his MBA at Dartmouth and worked on Wall Street before his family returned to Peru. In 1994 his father bought Banco Internacional del Peru but died the following year. Carlos became head of the bank and invested bank profits in numerous other businesses. In 1998 he founded Nexus Group, a private equity firm based in Panama. In 2011 he started InRetail, a holding company that has supermarkets, malls and drugstore and is now including health clinics for very low-income people. Carlos and his wife Gabriela have a family foundation that is focused on a program they began called Innova Schools, a K-12 education company that wants to make a significant improvement in Peruvian education. They have 26 schools already in operation serving over 16,000 kids. Carlos and Gabriela have two young children and live in both New York and Lima.
