Overview of What We Do

- **The Problem:** While access to education in underserved areas is improving, many schools are failing to achieve quality results.
- **Our Solution:** The eSchool 360 – a holistic technology solution to sustain high-quality education for less than \$3 a month per student.

Impact Network: Our Story

2009: Began Construction

- Built schools in rural Zambia



2011: Beyond the Build

- Shift in focus to delivering high-quality education



2013: Evaluation & Scaling

- Operate ten eLearning schools
- Third-party evaluation of program

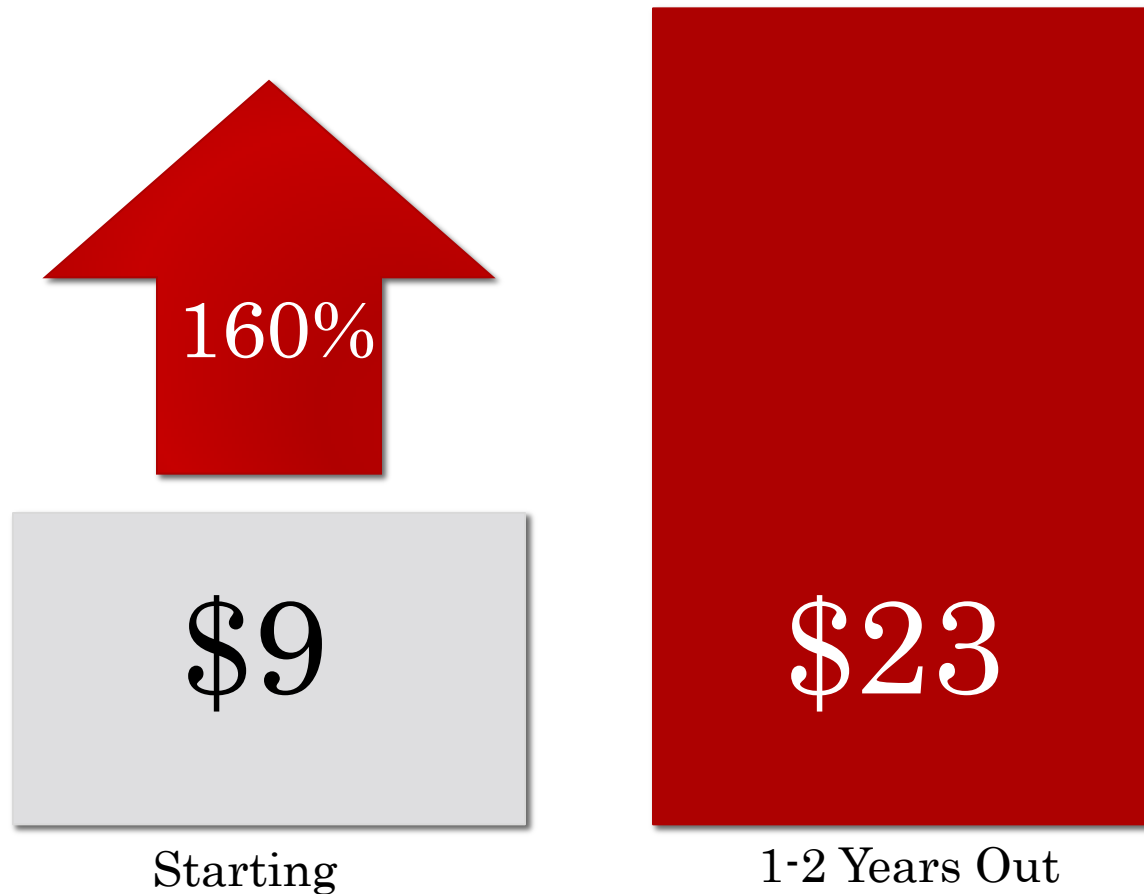
